

Any region in New Brunswick with a Family Division case management model must use many specific family law forms set out under **Rule 81**. As of September 17, 2018, this includes the regions of Saint John and Moncton. These forms differ from those in jurisdictions where the case management model has not been implemented. Under **Rule 81**, you must start most family law matters, including a divorce proceeding, using an **Application (Form 81A)**. Nevertheless, you may still find the guide to **“Doing Your Own Divorce in New Brunswick”** very helpful when completing the Trial Record. Although you cannot use form **72A (Petition for Divorce)** or **Form 72B (Joint Petition for Divorce)**, most other steps, forms and documents related to a divorce proceeding that are set out in the guide are the same for judicial districts operating under the case management model as for those jurisdictions who are not.
